The festivities of the “todos santos (deceased saints)” are part of the cultural and intangible heritage of Mexico. There are a splendid exhibitions with allusive decorations in museums and art galleries, in the surroundings of San Ángel, San Ángel Inn and Tlacopac.

This tour shows how the cultural heritage is preserved with a beautiful Mexican tradition.

Cultural activities take place from October 25 to November 4. They include workshops, plays, film exhibitions, books, concerts, a parade and many activities, as well as offerings and altars.

The tour is available for delegates, WF members and Congress attendees. It will have bilingual guides dressed in “Catrinas” folkloric costumes and traditional Mexican drinks such as tequila and mezcal, as well as coffee, soft drinks and water will be free of charge.
